


Russia's Greatest Atlantic Salmon Fishing

After two record-breaking seasons, the Ponoi is now available to Frontiers clients for 1993

During this past season, the fishing results were again amazing — 7,094 Atlantic salmon caught and released by our guests for an average of over five fish per rod per day across a 15-week season. As many more were hooked and lost. The largest salmon reported was over 30 pounds, the biggest on a dry fly, 23 pounds, and countless fish were caught in the 20-pound class.

As one guest said: "New silvery showers of salmon were coming in almost constantly, replenishing the pools. I have never witnessed such action-packed Atlantic salmon fishing in my 20-plus years of chasing these fish!"

A wonderful American-owned, managed and equipped tent camp is your home in a pristine wilderness setting. Spacious wood-floored American-made tents, with electric baseboard heating (new for '93) and Finnish wood stoves, are roomy and comfortable. Guests enjoy full electric power, instant hot water showers. new flush toilets, and an inviting heated dining tent where some of the best food imaginable is served. Randy Marks, a well-traveled angler from New York, said: "The meals here are as good as I've had in any hotel in Europe."

The Ponoi camp received universal praise from our guests last year. The staff and guides are terrific under the capable management of Tim Rajeff and Katherine Hart. This year's chefs previously cooked at one of Alaska's best fly-out lodges.

You'll enjoy safe, comfortable 18ft American boats with 55-hp jet units, plus we have two Aeroflot helicopters with veteran crews in camp to whisk you to more remote beats.

The Ponoi is fly-fishing-only and catch-and-release. It's a big, gentle gradient river with greatly varying character, providing the opportunity to fish as you like — wading, bank casting or boat fishing. Most of the fishing is with floating line. The Ponoi has established itself as one of the best rivers in the world for dry fly


fishing for salmon — some weeks, nearly half the salmon caught were taken on dries.

Reliable Finnair, the airline of Finland, has renewed direct flight service to the Kola from Helsinki to Murmansk. This permits avoiding the hassle of big Russian cities and long flights on Russian planes. The Kola Peninsulahas remained peaceful, with none of the unrest that has occurred in other areas of Russia.


Costs round-trip Helsinki for the inclusive 7-night/6-day fishing package are actually a bit less than 1992.

We now have everyone placed from the '91 and '92 seasons and still have some prime openings available from June to September, 1993. They represent your chance to live a part of Atlantic salmon fishing history. Inclusive costs round-trip Murmansk range from \$5,850 to \$7,190, depending on the week.

Costs include helicopter flight from Murmansk directly to the Ponoi camp and return; seven nights and six full fishing days; all meals and accommodations at the river; fishing permits; one guide, boat and motor for each two anglers, plus allocated time in our camp helicopters for quick delivery to more remote beats while at the river.




What Makes the Ponoi Unique Among All Russian Rivers?

- 1) The consistency of the fishing throughout the whole season. The "worst" week last year produced over 200 Atlantic salmon.
- 2) The combination of incredible numbers and attractive size. The Ponoi has been so good that operators and agents at other rivers try to label it "a grilse river," which it is not.
- 3) No poaching, no local fishermen, no civilization encroachment. You have both banks exclusively along 50 miles of productive water where no one else but our guests is permitted to fish.
- 4) No pollution. The water is pure, radiation levels have been measured and readings have been uniformly negative.
- 5) American, Canadian and Russian guides who work hard for you.

- 6) Size of the beats. You have more water to fish each day than you can possibly cover.
- 7) Productive dry fly fishing under normal conditions throughout the season.
- 8) Ease of access via reliable Finnair service from Helsinki, an attractive European capital.
- 9) The comforts of the Ponoi camp, its efficient staff, the quality of meals and its beautiful setting.
- **10)** The reliability and reputation of Frontiers. All of your travel arrangements are coordinated professionally to meet your objectives.
- 11) The esthetics of the fishing. Fish as you prefer whether wading, bank casting or by boat. This combination accommodates weather variables, different water levels, and your ability.

- **12)** No long walks are required to reach pools or beats.
- 13) The fabulous "home pool" right in front of camp is available to you 24 hours a day, yet is not in the beat rotation. It has produced up to 200 fish per week to anglers who like to fish early or late beyond the normal fishing day.




