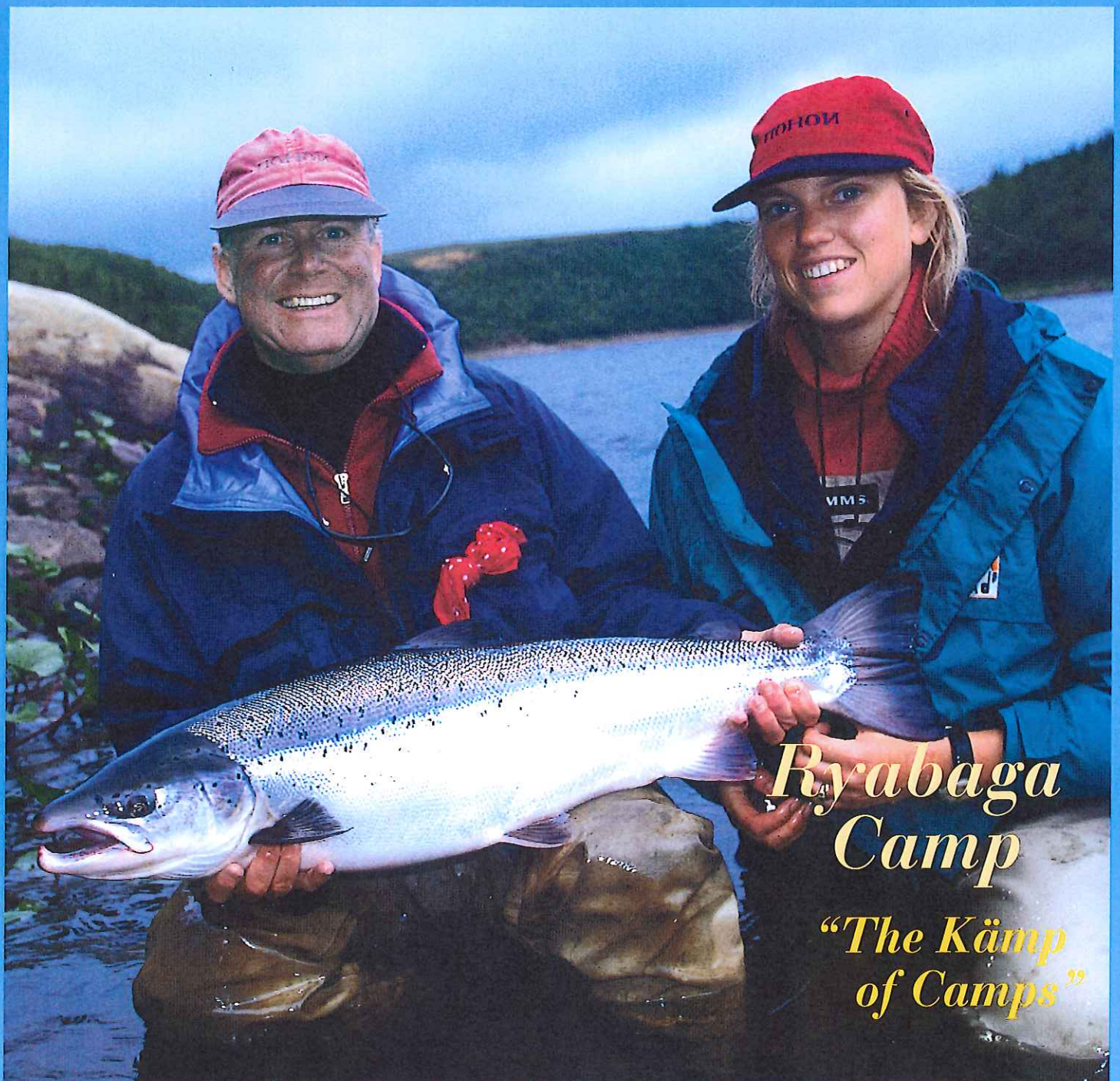


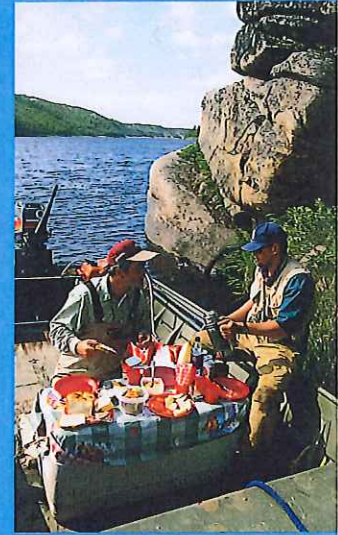
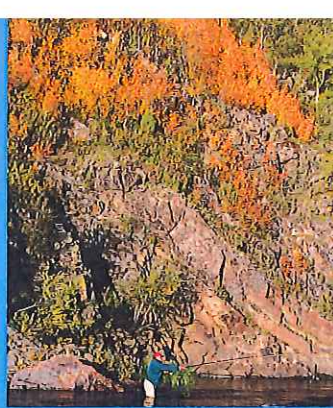

Ryabaga Camp

The Ryabaga Camp provides up to 20 guests a week with the finest Atlantic salmon fishing in the world today. Not only does the Ponoj yield 6000 – 9000 salmon per season over a ten-year average but also the fish are a very good size averaging 8.8lbs with countless fish from 10 to 28lbs. No week historically averages less than 17 fish per rod per week – some weeks have yielded over 1000 + salmon to a maximum 20 rods in a single week.

The Ryabaga Camp has become as famous for its service as it has its fishing. Guests marvel at the standard of service, facilities and food quality that have been made possible in this truly remote location. A combination of long serving, well-trained Russian and Western staff, makes up an impressive team including five

mechanics, four chefs, four housekeeping staff, a masseuse and doctor as well as twelve highly experienced guides. No expense is spared, nor service opportunity missed, to ensure the finest fishing camp in the world is provided to our discerning, loyal guests, which is why we have chosen the Hotel Kämp as our gateway base for those coming to Ryabaga.

We draw our guide team from around the world and boast a fine mix of Russian guides who have worked with us for up to nine years as well as guides from the US, UK, South Africa and New Zealand. All guides are fully trained in the





safe use of jet boats; in helicopter safety and CPR, as well as being expert fishermen, guides and teachers. We believe that the guides on the Ponoï make a huge difference in enhancing the experience and countless numbers of guests return home feeling that their time with Ponoï guides has changed their personal enjoyment of fishing forever, as well as being a fun, social experience.

We also take great care of the Ponoï. We have operated scientific work on the river for many years with the assistance of the Atlantic Salmon Federation and PINRO (Polar Research Institute). The spawning beds, young fish densities and influential sea-temperatures, are monitored carefully, yet the river is completely wild with no netting or stocking and we leave it that way. We involve our guests in our work with our ongoing tagging program and all fishing is catch and release fly-fishing. Experts have called Ponoï "the healthiest Atlantic salmon River in the world."

Please join us for the world's best Atlantic salmon fishing, enjoying fine accommodation, cuisine and service from a highly experienced and dedicated staff. Prices from US\$4,390/ week from Murmansk which is accessed by once weekly, non-stop Finnair jet service from Helsinki. Season is late May to late September.



Pacha Creek Camp

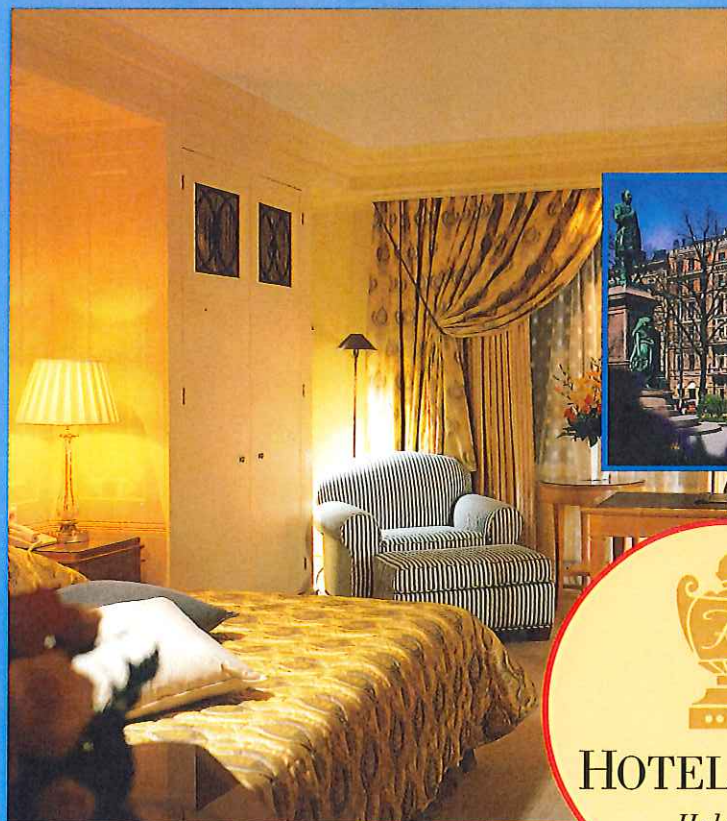
The Ponoï small camp alternative

The Pacha Creek camp is set among attractive red pines where the Pacha Creek joins the Ponoï 50 miles above Ryabaga. An experienced Russian staff that we have known for many years operate the camp, which takes a maximum of 8 rods. They have

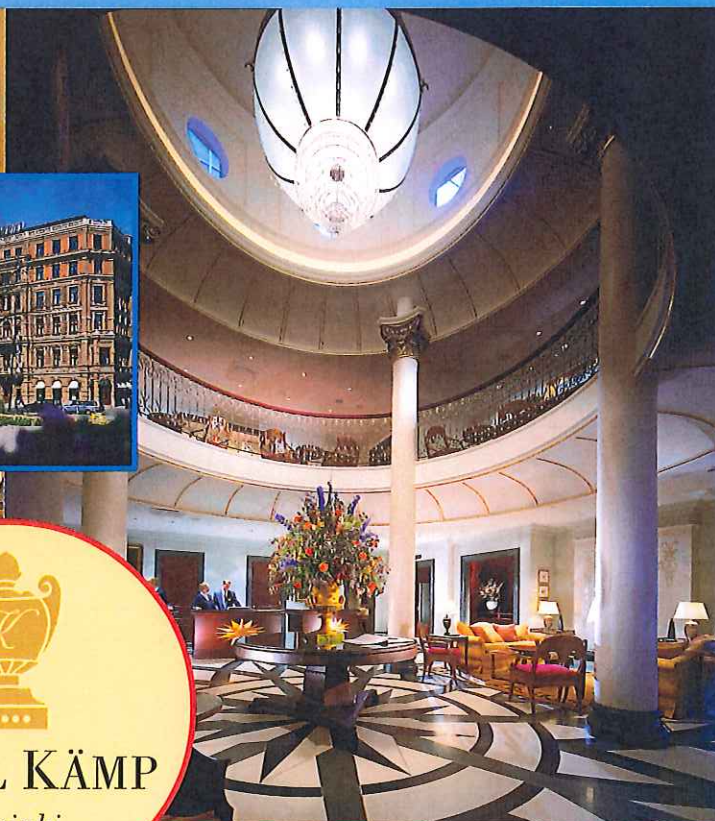


proven that they can run a fine operation outfitted to similar standards to Ryabaga. The camp offers a private party, or those seeking a smaller camp atmosphere, the opportunity to enjoy the outstanding Ponoï fishing. Such smaller groups allow for the options to adjust fishing hours, to eat at different times and to mix and match fishing beats.

The camp is only available during the prime weeks in June, early July, late August and September when catch statistics run between 15 to 25 fish per rod per week. Prices run from \$2800-\$4200/week from Murmansk.



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
